SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The notation '[NP]' in a rule in the Sailing Instructions (SIs) means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1 (a).

1 RULES

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS)*.
- 1.2 RRS 40.1 (personal floatation devices) is in effect.

2 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 2.1 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 0900 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will effect.

3 COMMUNICATIONS WITH COMPETITORS

- 3.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located at <https://kingstonyachtclub.com/foilkingston2021>.
- 3.2 On the water, the Race committee intends to monitor and communicate with competitors on VHF radio channel 72.

4 CODE OF CONDUCT

- 4.1 [DP] Competitors and support persons shall comply with reasonable requests from race officials, KYC staff members, or launch area volunteers.
- 4.2 Boats not racing shall remain clear of areas where boats are racing and any official boat.

5 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 5.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed at the main flagpole located mid-harbour at Portsmouth Olympic Harbour.

5.2 When the flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 30 minutes' in the Race Signal AP.

6 SCHEDULE OF RACES

6.1 To alert boats that a race or sequence of races will begin soon, the orange starting line flag will be displayed with one sound at least five minutes before a warning signal is made.

8. RACING AREA

8.1 Racing will be conducted in the area south of Portsmouth Olympic Harbour.

9. COURSES

9.1 The diagrams in SI Addendum A show the courses, the course designations, and the order in which marks are to be passed and the side on which each mark is to be left.

10 MARKS

Mark	Description
1	Yellow inflatable
2a, 2b	Green inflatables
2s/2p	Green inflatables
3s/3p	Green inflatables
Start Mark	Yellow inflatable Start Pin
Finish Mark	Red inflatable

11. THE START

11.1 The starting line will be between the staff displaying an orange flag on the committee boat and the start mark.

11.3 A boat that does not start within 4 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes RRS A5.1 and A5.2.

12 THE FINISH

12.1 The finish line will be between the staff displaying the blue flag on the committee boat and the finish mark.

12.2 [DP] Boats that have finished racing shall sail clear of the finish area.

13 PENALTY SYSTEM

13.1 RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

14 TIME LIMITS AND TARGET TIMES

14.1 The time limits and targets for each race will be as follows:

Class	WASZP	Multihull
Target Time	20 minutes	45 minutes
Race Time limit	60 minutes	75 minutes
Mark 1 Time limit	15 minutes	15 minutes
Finish Time Window	15 minutes	20 minutes

14.2 If no competitor has passed Mark 1 within the Mark 1 time limit, the race will be abandoned.

14.3 Failure to meet target time will not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).

15 HEARING REQUESTS

15.1 The protest time limit is 90 minutes after the last boat finishes the last race of the day or the race committee signals no more racing today, whichever is later. The time will be posted on the official notice board.

15.2 Hearing request forms are available on-line (<https://www.sailing.ca/protests-appeals/>), from the protest committee or on-shore volunteers.

15.3 Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearing may be a mix of in-person and videoconference. The location, date and time of hearings will be posted on the notice board.

16 [DP][NP] SAFETY REGULATIONS

16.1. Competitors shall check in with shore volunteers at the launching area prior to racing and again following racing.

16.2 A competitor that retires from a race shall notify the Race committee, a safety boat, or a launch area volunteer as soon as possible.

17 SUPPORT BOATS

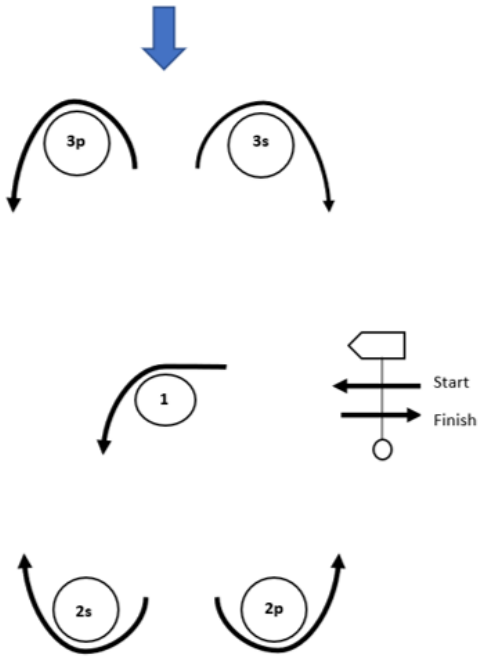
17.1 Team leaders, coaches and other support persons shall stay outside of areas where competitors are racing from the time of the preparatory signal until all competitors have finished or retired or the Race committee signals a postponement, general recall, or abandonment.

17.2 All support boats must register with the organizing authority.

19 TRASH DISPOSAL

19.1 Trash may be placed aboard official [or support person] vessels.
